## How to Locate a Form on the TexasLawHelp.org Website

- Find an available public computer. Use your mouse or keyboard to wake up the computer from sleep mode. No log-in password is required.
- Double click on the icon labeled TexasLawH... or TexasLawHelp. The icon looks like this:

- After you click on the TexasLawHelp icon, the following page will appear:

- If you are looking for forms about divorce, name change, paternity, child support, or other family issues, hover over Topics and select Family, Divorce, and Children (See red arrow.)
- If you do not see what you need, you can type what you are looking for in the Search box. For example, you can type "occupational license" in the Search box. (See green arrow.)
- Each topic has several guides and articles related to common legal situations (See example below). Select the self-help guide or article that most relates to your legal situation or question by clicking on the guide or article title, or by clicking Explore Guide.

- Note the Computer Number assigned to the computer you are working on. The Computer Number is taped to the top of the computer monitor.
- Tell the copy center attendant that you've printed documents from your Computer Number and that you're ready to pay for them. The cost for black \& white printouts or copies is 10 cents per page. The attendant will provide you with the copies of your documents after you pay for them.
